The standards are vague, teachers are placing grades in the standard that fits best, students don't know what they are being graded on, and most importantly there is less ability for students to get support. It is a blind way of assessing and detrimental to the ability for students to advocate for themselves, and dangerous as teachers will teach to the standards only. The measuring of student learning should be clear for teachers, students and parents to support their children. The stigma that by taking away grades students will feel more confident is not true. There is still a value system in place. Better teaching and caring atmospheres don't necessarily equate with how we grade.

Favorable SBG is an excellent assessment system that I believe fixes many of the issues with the traditional system. Traditional grades often felt arbitrary with kids having to check off boxes to get an A. With SBG, students look to challenge themselves to show their proficiency. I've been at schools that implemented full SBG (PC uses SRG) differently than PC so I was a bit skeptical that the differences would help our students. However, I've been pleasantly surprised. I usually have around 20 or so students with D's and F's at the end of the quarter. So far I've only had 4. Our students really stepped up to the plate and took responsibility for their learning and growth. Like all new systems, SRG and eventually SBG will have some kinks that need to be worked out, but in my experience the benefits are clear.
